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
Google Scholar Quick Abstracts

BioOne Complete abstracts are now included in Quick Abstracts, a new Google Scholar feature that gives researchers improved access to content on Android and Apple phones.

Quick Abstracts presents mobile Google Scholar users with branded, full abstracts from indexed articles related to their search as part of a clean and easy to browse user experience that links to the full text on the publisher's site. Readers can also add the article to a favorites list and view related content, all from one preview screen. This list of favorites can then be accessed from any computer/device from the user's Google Scholar account.

While most users do not read full-text articles on their phones, an increasing number use their mobile devices to search for articles to bookmark for later use. Quick Abstracts offers these users a more in-depth browsing experience, while making accessing this content more intuitive.

This feature is not only a critical adaption to a changing researcher workflow, but one that has the potential to drive increased usage to content published in BioOne Complete.


2017 : A Year in Review

BioOne's 2017 Report Card

BioOne enjoyed a very good year in 2017. BioOne Complete offered 200 journals from 146 societies, associations, museums, and independent presses;



- added **10,793** new articles, many to an Issue-in-Progress through our article-based publishing workflow; generated over **15 million page views** from more than 1.45 million pages;
- delivered **1,448 institutional subscriptions**;
- increased worldwide net sales by **1.4%** over 2016, to \$6,752,164;
- exhibited a **93% renewal rate**, plus growth in under-represented markets; and
- returned over \$44 million dollars to publishers since 2001.



At a time when libraries are experiencing severe purchasing constraints, BioOne Complete's publishing partners, pricing strategy, and strong brand continue to make the collection both attractive and affordable. We are proud that over half of BioOne Complete's subscribers are located outside North America. Plus, BioOne's participation in various philanthropic programs provides free access to more than 2,500 institutions throughout the developing world that would not otherwise have access to this wealth of knowledge.

Upgrades to our platform in 2017 include BioOne's transition to the NISO Journal Article Tag Suite (JATS) standard that supports additional metadata in XML conversion for deposits to Crossref and the display of articles. This richer metadata allows for the wider dissemination of publisher content and makes it easier to find and use.

New in 2017 is our BioOne Career Center. An important addition to BioOne's suite of services, the Career Center provides employers and job seekers across the sciences with an easy-to-use, curated portal from a trusted source. Full- and part-time professional positions are complemented by internships, volunteer opportunities, and conference announcements.

BioOne is moving full speed ahead on mission in 2018 to bring together organizations and individuals. We look forward to sharing updates on other BioOne projects that are designed to enhance scholarly communication in the biosciences.


